





1.11 NCA Accreditation 2017 -

NCA ACCREDITATION 2017 – MEDICAL EVALUATION STANDARD

- Purpose specialized medical evaluations and treatment are available to all CAC clients and coordinated as part of the MDT
- o Criteria Essential Component (not optional)

1.12 Specific training – at least one of the following:

SPECIFIC TRAINING – AT LEAST ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

- Child Abuse Pediatrics Sub-board eligibility or certification
- Physician, Advanced Practice Nurse, and Physician Assistants
 - · Minimum 16 hours formal didactic training
- SANEs (RN)
 - Minimum 40 hours coursework followed by demonstrated competency based clinical preceptorship

1.13 Medical Director (physician or advanced practice nurse)

MEDICAL DIRECTOR (PHYSICIAN OR ADVANCED PRACTICE NURSE)


- Required for non-advanced practice nurses
 - Develop practice protocols
 - Treatment needs
 - Referrals process medical or mental health

1.14 Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI)


CONTINUOUS QUALITY IMPROVEMENT (CQI)

- Knowledgeable recent research and practices
- All medical professionals providing services at a CAC must
 - Demonstrate continuing education in the field of child abuse – minimum of 8 contact hours every 2 years
 - Share this information with the CAC records keeping


